Department of Resident Life

HEALTH & WELLNESS

University Counseling Center

SHIP & Health Insurance Waiver

Every year, all domestic undergraduate students registered for 6 or more credits must enroll in or waive the Student Health Insurance Plan (SHIP). Students with access to their own health insurance plans can waive the SHIP by visiting health.umd.edu.

Immunization Policy

Testudo

Testudo is one of UMD's most valuable resources and our interactive web services hub for current students and alumni. Students can use Testudo to update their address or email, view the schedule

of classes, register for semester coursework, view their unofficial transcript, and so much more.

Academic Advising & Course Registration

During New Student Orientation, every incoming undergraduate student will meet with an academic advisor in their academic college to enroll in classes for the upcoming semester. The registration process is for students only and allows academic advisors to connect with each student to review any transfer credits and AP/IB scores, discuss major and college requirements, and help students plan for their future at UMD and beyond.

. What forms of payment does the University of Maryland accept?

2. When are bills generated and due?

- A student bill is generated with any new applicable charges on the 25th day of every month and is due on the 20th day of the following month.
- Fall and Spring Semester Tuition & Fees bills are due August 20th and January 20th respectively.

3. How does my student get their semester refund from excess financial aid?

 Students should enroll in direct deposit to receive funds as quickly as possible. Visit billpay. umd.edu/refunds for more information and to enroll.

4. How can I gain access to see my student's account information, balance information, get email reminders for when an upcoming bill is due, etc.?

• Students can grant access to both academic and financial aspects of their account so you can see account balance information, get email reminders for when an upcoming bill is due, see grades, etc. Visit billpay.umd.edu/parents for instructions on how to set this access up.

5. When should my student have received their financial aid offer?

- March 1st-Fall Admitted Students & Freshmen Connection Students
- May 2nd- Incoming Fall Transfers
- November 1st- Incoming Spring Transfers

6. Does my student need to complete FAFSA every year?

 Yes, in order to receive aid for the upcoming academic year, your student must complete the FAFSA every year. FAFSA becomes available October 1st and students must submit FAFSA by the January 1st priority deadline.

7. What types of aid would be included in a financial aid offer?

• Financial aid offers can include grants, scholarships, loans, and federal work-study.

8. My student has received private scholarships. How do we apply this to their student bill?

• Students can bring their scholarship check to the Lee Building so that it can be credited to their student account. They should make sure to include their UID # on the check. Private scholarship checks can also be mailed to the address below:


